2. The role

Role

Lead direct and motivate an operational team to safely deliver an agreed programme of work and emergency response within a defined geographical area so that assets operate to set performance standards and flood risk is minimised.

Principal accountabilities

- Provide effective leadership on health and safety matters by actively promoting health and safety awareness and ensuring the provision and use of safe working practices to ensure compliance with Environment Agency policy and standards.
- Contribute to the Operations Delivery Management Team by participating in the identification and development of business/work plans in order to ensure flood risk assets perform to agreed standards.
- Plan, allocate and control resources to maximise the efficient and effective use of people (including contractors), equipment and allocated budget in order to ensure that programmed and other work is completed to time, cost and quality targets.
- Provide an effective resource to deliver an emergency response capability for floods and other environmental incidents, to minimise the impact of the incident.
- Provide effective leadership and communication by example and clear direction so that the team identifies with the Environment Agency's culture and vision and achieves agreed programmes of work.
- Develop and implement training and succession plans to ensure the team maintains the full range of competencies to undertake the work required.
- Establish and maintain relationships with landowners, local environment bodies and local community groups to enable smooth delivery of work programmes

 Respond to daily changing circumstances impacting on the work programming, by rescheduling work, priorities and resources to ensure the overall objectives of the team are still met.

Knowledge/Qualifications

Relevant vocational training in a related discipline.

Skills/Abilities/Experience

You will be happy to lead, motivate, challenge and develop others. You will need to demonstrate an understanding of performance management and be positive and self-motivated. You will direct and inspire a team on your own initiative. You'll be confident managing and prioritising complex workloads, tight deadlines and ever changing priorities. You will be able to demonstrate excellent communication and influencing skills, be customer-focused, and aware of wider environmental outcomes and the need to manage our reputation.

In addition to being operationally effective, you will need to be a strategic thinker with the ability to plan to ensure we adapt to new challenges. Excellent training and support will be provided and no specialist skills are needed, but experience of delivering practical outcomes both in a planned proactive way and a reactive (incident) manner is desirable.

3. Salary and benefits

Join us in this role and you will enjoy the following benefits:

Leave entitlement: Your leave allowance in this role will be 27 days plus bank holidays

(pro-rata - if part time or an assignment).

We also offer up to two days paid environmental outcome days each year. These give you the opportunity to take part in community activities with a clear environmental outcome for people and wildlife.

Pension: We will enrol you into the Environment Agency Pension Fund (EAPF)

on commencing employment, if your employment contract is for 3 months or more. The EAPF is part of the Local Government Pension Scheme (LGPS). It is a career average scheme, which means you will build up benefits based on your pay each scheme year rather

than your final salary.

We will base your pension contributions on your actual pay and you will receive tax and national insurance relief on your contributions. The pension contribution rates currently range between 5.5% to 12.5%. Whilst you are in the scheme we will also pay an employer contribution into your pension pot. We currently pay

18.5%, so this is a very generous scheme.

Work/life balance: We support flexible working hours and practices to help you strike a

good balance between your work life and your personal life. We will also encourage you to keep developing your skills and professional

knowledge throughout your career.

Diversity: We are committed to diversity and inclusion. We want all our staff to

feel valued and respected and to see this as a great place to work.

Please note that Environment Agency employees are not civil servants so you may wish to check your eligibility for continuity of employment by contacting your HR department. All eligible bodies are listed in the Redundancy Payments (Continuity of Employment in Local Government etc) (Modification) Order 1999.

Employment agency workers and contractors are considered to be external candidates and should therefore only apply for positions that are being advertised externally. They are also not eligible to claim continuity of employment should they be successful in securing a position with the Environment Agency.

We apply the Baseline Personnel Security Standard (BPSS) check when recruiting staff to our posts. This includes a basic criminal records check. Some posts may require CTC level security clearance, this will be confirmed to you during the recruitment process.

For the great majority of roles in the Environment Agency this will be sufficient and only certain roles will require a higher level of clearance. Should this be necessary, you will be advised of this during the recruitment process.

Committee Membership: If you have been a member of a Regional Flood and Coastal Committee in the last 12 months we will not be able to continue with your application based on agreed appointment rules related to employing ex-RFCC members. We would welcome an application from you once the 12 month period has passed.

5. How to apply

We use an online recruitment system. To make the application process simple and straightforward, and so that you know how it works and what we need from you, we've put together a few hints and tips.

The first thing you need to do is sign up to our recruitment system. You will need a valid e-mail address to log in and apply for opportunities, as all communication from us will be via e-mail. You can do this via the vacancy you are interested in by selecting 'Apply' at the bottom of the advert. (For some jobs, you'll be asked to download a candidate pack, like this one, where you'll find specific application instructions.) Once you've clicked this link you'll then be asked 'Do you have the right to live and work in the UK?', 'Do you have the required qualifications or equivalent experience, which were stated in the job advert?' and 'Are you currently an employee of this organisation?' Simply answer yes or no and you can carry on with your application. You'll then see the 'Register' page. Simply complete the details and select 'Submit Registration' and register to the system. You only need to sign up to the system once; you'll just be able to login next time.

When it comes to the actual application, you need to fill out each section, please be aware that the system will automatically time out if you are inactive for more than 60 minutes. This will result in any unsaved information being lost so make sure you save what you are doing regularly. Once you've finished, your details and information will be saved on the system for any future applications – of course, you can edit your details at any point.

When you apply to the Environment Agency for a job we will ask you to provide your personal data on our application form. We need this information so that we can establish your identity and your right to work in the UK.

You can read our Data Protection Statement on the application process page of our recruitment system. It is also available for reference on each page of the actual application.

Competence Questions/Statement

We're keen to know what makes you right for the job you're applying for and why we should ask you in for an interview. The competence questions/statements are your chance to convince us! You should demonstrate how your skills, qualities and experience meet the requirements of the job (as described in the job advert and candidate pack). And instead of simply telling us, show us: use real life examples of where you've used a certain skill or how you've practically applied your experience.

There's a 250 word limit per competence including spaces. It's a really important part of the selection process so make sure you keep your statement relevant and concise. Think about what we need to know about you and what you'd bring to the role and our organisation.

Application questions

For some roles, we'll ask you some specific questions, like if you have a preferred work location. If you're disabled and you'd like to be part of our Guaranteed Interview Scheme, you can add this information in here.

Equality and Diversity

We're committed to reflecting the communities we serve and we'd like you to tell us about yourself and your background.

Submitting your application
